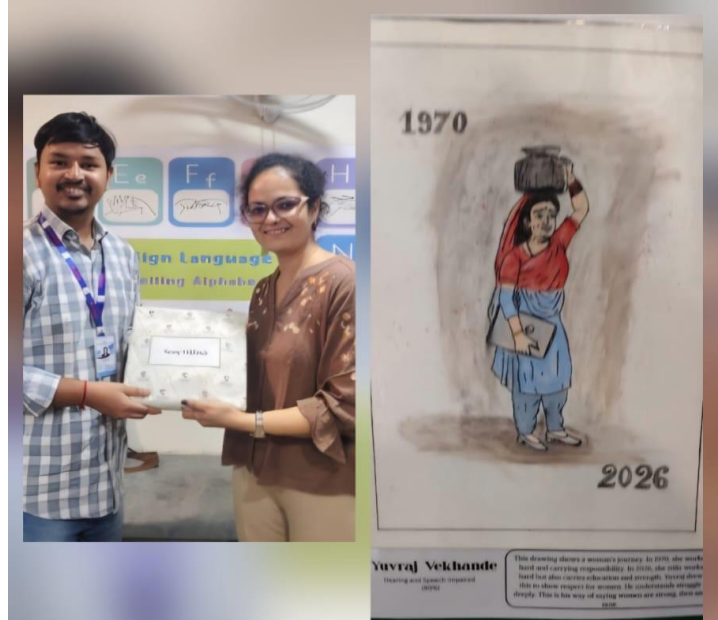
News from... Swami Parijnanashram Educational and Vocational Centre, Virar

Durva is a special type of grass that holds great significance in the worship of Shri Ganesha. It is considered to be the oldest variety among plants and has the capacity to withstand drought, requiring very little moisture. It is the staple food for cows, horses, goats, deer and rabbits.

The humble blade of grass has been trampled upon by various creatures for centuries as it survived many upheavals in the cycle of evolution.
